



Internationalization at Manipal Academy of Higher Education

### An interaction to remember: Hon'ble External Affairs Minister visits MAHE

Dr. S Jaishankar, Minister for External Affairs, Government of India, visited Manipal Academy of Higher Education on 19 March 2023. He was invited as a guest speaker for the 29th leadership lecture series of TAPMI Manipal. Dr. H S Ballal, Pro-chancellor; Dr. M D Venkatesh, Vicechancellor of MAHE; Dr. M D Nalapat, Professor of Geopolitics & UNESCO Peace Chair, and other MAHE officials participated in the program. The minister addressed a crowd of nearly 800 people that included MAHE faculty, staff, and students. Indeed an exciting moment for the University, the students were looking forward to interacting and gaining deeper insights into the Indian perspective of globalization and its stance in promoting education on the international platform.



During his interaction with international students, Dr. S Jaishankar emphasized the student exchange programs initiated by the Government of India. He remarked that student exchanges were a productive way to connect to the world, and expressed that initiating such exchanges facilitate international mobility in the post-covid world.

Answering students' questions on India as an education hub, Dr. Jaishankar said, "We have to work more at it. We are trying to become a much more natural destination, and if we consciously work on attracting more students, it is possible." The minister also commented on the increasing trend of distance education, "When Prime Minister Modi became PM, he promised to educate 50 thousand African students. The concept of distance education has made an enormous breakthrough after Covid," he stated.

It was a dream come true moment for the students from the Department of Geopolitics & International Relations, MAHE, when they had the opportunity to interact with the External Affairs Minister. The students were keen to know his views on the global issues and current affairs revolving around India-EU relations, BRICS, China-Pakistan diplomacy, and how India is surviving these geopolitical challenges.


#### A to Z about Manipal Summer School 2023

# Making Public Health Practical: KMC launches exclusive healthcare course

In developing countries, there is a high prevalence of tropical diseases, and doctors in these areas face challenges due to the high cost of post-graduate courses and limited opportunities. To address this issue, MSF (Médecins Sans Frontières) International introduced the Global



and the function of the course is to improve patient and programmatic care in areas where it is most needed.

The GHHM course utilizes blended learning methodology, with weekly seminars led by National and International experts at collaborating institutes, such as Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Christian Medical College, Vellore and JIPMER, Puducherry. The course is open to medical doctors with a minimum of two years of work experience. Successful completion of the program leads to the award of a Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene (DTMH) by the Royal College of Physicians, London, UK.

### Deakin University VC strengthens partnership with MAHE to promote global citizenship

Deakin University's Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Iain Martin, recently visited MAHE Manipal in a bid to strengthen the longstanding relationship between the two prestigious universities. #### MAHE PhD student bags an Int. award and visits the Arctic



Mr. Sagar Filipe Wankhede, a PhD Research Scholar from the Department of Civil Engineering, Manipal Institute of Technology, MAHE, was awarded the Svalbard Integrated Arctic Earth Observing System (SIOS) Early Career Researcher (ECR) award recently. This award covered his to and fro travel and accommodation in Svalbard, near the North Pole. This award was granted to him to present his research

during the Polar Night Week conference, held at Longyearbyen, Svalbard. He spent one month in the Arctic, at the international observatory SIOS between January 20 and February 20, 2023, presenting his research paper and interacting with the researchers of SIOS. His work is expected to improve understanding of the melting properties of the glaciers, in the context of global warming.

Mr. Sagar was the only recipient of this travel award from Asia, and the first person to travel to Svalbard, Arctic, from the Manipal Academy of Higher Education.

# **Experience MAHE**

#### **Lilian Geny: Voyage from France to MAHE**



My name is Lilian. I'm a software engineering student from Paris. In the context of my studies, I had the opportunity to do an exchange semester with MAHE. I came to Manipal to conduct a project and arrived here on September 10th from Paris. I remember I felt very disoriented on my way to Manipal; everything was so different, and the culture shock was brutal; I was assaulted by so much information. The first few weeks were all about getting used to life in India and overcoming the culture shock phase. Here is a nonexhaustive list of things I had to adapt to- Climate, cows on the street, chaotic traffic, noise, a lot of honking, food, transportation, gestures, and much more. In India, I was a foreigner which is something I was confronted with for the first time. I got a lot of attention because I was white. Some people were asking me for photos on the street, were shaking hands... I felt like a celebrity, although I've done nothing to be considered as such.

I visited as many places as I could- Murudeshwar, Kudremukh, Agumbe, Goa, Rajasthan, Bangalore, Delhi, and the Taj Mahal. I felt like each day in India was an adventure. I had so many things to learn, to try, and to understand that I couldn't really stick to a routine. But the people in India were always very helpful to me, and I rarely had a bad experience with anyone. This experience was incredible on the personal side. I feel it made me evolve. I feel more patient than before, I took a humility lesson. I learned to go outside my comfort zone. I learned to adapt myself to any situation, I learned to let worries go. I'll miss the colors and the intensity from India. I know I'll come back again. Written by Lilian Geny

#### **Aravind Kamath: Journey from Australia to MAHE**

During January 2023, KMC Manipal gave me the opportunity to undertake a student observership at Kasturba Hospital Manipal in orthopaedics, ophthalmology and general surgery. I have been coming back to India, my country of birth since I was a child. However, this trip was a new experience for me, being able to see the Indian medical system function and being able to learn from my fellow medical professionals in India. It was a privilege to be in an institution founded by TMA Pai, a Konkan man of which I am myself also. Overall, my experiences were very positive, especially due to the quality of medical staff whom I was shadowing.



Compared to Australia, the Indian system has much higher patient volumes, with the level of resources and medical cover for patients differing immensely. Yet, the Indian system flourishes and effectively provides care to people from all walks of life. I say to my Australian colleagues – India is fast medicine and Australia is slow medicine. Both are effective in their own ways. But if you tried to swap the two systems, the Australian system would not work in India and the Indian system would not work in Australia! That is the beauty of the Indian system. I left with a tinge of sadness since my time in KMC Manipal was so enjoyable and I didn't feel like leaving. My time there has left me with great memories. I would like to thank my supervisors in each of my rotations – A/Prof Madhava Pai from the orthopaedics spinal unit, Prof Rajagopal Shenoy from general surgery and Prof Yogish Kamath from ophthalmology, as well as Dr Freston Sirur and the International Office for helping organise my elective.
