
World Occupational Therapy Day: International Workshop at Vietnam

Rediscovering Humanity: UNESCO Dialogue for Peace at MAHE

Under the UNESCO Chair for Peace and Non-Violence led by Dr. M. D. 


Centre for Intercultural Studies and Dialogue garners International recognition for films on regional culture


MAHE Postgrad Wins Best Presenter for Tele-ECG Study in Singapore Cardiology Symposium






A doorstep into a collaborative future : Dr. Ankita Shetty's visit to Malaysian University


