Manipal School of Nursing, MCON, MAHE, Manipal organized a guest lecture by Ms Sangeetha Lobo (alumnus DNM 2000 – 2003) Quality Manager, Indiana Hospital, Mangalore on the topic "Performance Indicators in Nursing during COVID-19 Pandemic. She gave an overview of Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI), National Accreditation Board of Hospitals and

Healthcare Providers (NABH) Nursing Excellence Standards, Nursing Quality Indicators (NQI), Key Performance Indicators (KPI), why to measure, what to measure and COVID-19 related KPI.

Her lecture included key messages like "Nursing heads should have facts and data when they approach management while representing achievements, improvement in nursing services or demand for resources. It is essential to have management support for all



nursing activities. Regular audits should be conducted, recorded and reviewed.

How systematic is a systematic review?

Dr Sunita Panda, a Post-doctoral research fellow in School of Nursing and Midwifery, Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland (alumnus of MCON-MSc. Nursing 2002 – 2004 batch), shared her experience of carrying out a systematic review.

She discussed the steps of conducting a systematic review, meta-synthesis and data extraction for qualitative studies. The challenges faced by the researcher in publishing a research paper, was also discussed.
