Manipal college of Nursing, MAHE utilizes Management Information System services in the areas related to Students and faculty. The Student information system (SIS) consists of the details of the students' right from admission process until the students graduate. These include student qualifications, attendance, examination scores, achievements and participation of student in various activities organized by the college and the university. Management information system for faculty consists of employee details, leave details, salary details, and all other services provided to the staff. Faculty and student feedback also are obtained through online mode.

From the academic year 2021-22 will move from SIS to SLCM (Student Life Cycle Management)- SLCM consists of information related to the student from admission to graduation. The documents related to admission process, implementation of curriculum including time table, data related to the leave of absence and extracurricular activities, will be available at the portal. This portal makes the students' life easier as they access the curriculum implementation plan from the software on their smartphones.

CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Manipal College of Nursing has two undergraduate courses; Basic BSc Nursing which is four years program with an yearly enrolment of 100 students and Post Basic B.Sc (P.B.B.Sc) Nursing of two years duration with an yearly intake of 50 students. Post graduate programs are of two years duration; i.e., MSc nursing with yearly intake 40 students and Nurse Practitioner in Critical Care Post Graduate Residency Program with yearly intake of 20 students. There are also post basic diploma courses and MPhil nursing programs. For PhD Nursing programs MCON follow MAHE guidelines. For all the programs, the syllabus is obtained from the Indian Nursing Council except for MPhil nursing and PhD. Curriculum revisions are done at the college level by the curriculum committee and approval is sought from Board of Studies and Academic Council of the MAHE. For the implementation of the curriculum, Academic Master plan is prepared by June every year. Class coordinator prepares the academic plan for the class by July. Subject Coordinator prepares the plans for each subject (clinical and theory) prior to commencement of academic year. For evaluating the students, both formative and summative evaluation methods are used. Summative evaluation is by university examination; both theory and practical. Formative evaluation is done by sessional examinations and assignments. Every week departmental clinical meetings are conducted and once a month department meetings are conducted. During this time progress of teaching and learning is discussed. Any deviation from regular planned activity is rectified. Monthly meeting of HoD's with Dean (Core committee) is also conducted where the progress of each of the batches as well as issues related to implementation of curriculum are discussed. Every month faculty meeting is held during which the progress and evaluation of the students are presented by the class coordinator. Feedback given by the students is communicated to the faculty during these meetings and need for improvement is emphasized.

weightage for the sessional examination is 10 marks each and the assignment carries weightage of 3 and Coursera carries 2 marks. Besides this the students are also given unit test at the classroom by the respective subject teachers at the completion of the unit. Periodically they are also evaluated with objective type questions during classes.

The students must secure 50% of the IA marks to be eligible for the university examination. Students must satisfy the eligibility criteria of 80% attendance before the university examination.

Progress report including the sessional examination marks and attendance percentage are sent periodically to the parents and they are asked to acknowledge the receipt of the progress report.

Result analysis following university examination and supplementary examination is done. Performance of the students is monitored.

Feedback is also obtained from the external examiner (Practical) regarding the students' performance in practical examination.

2.5.3 Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The academic team comprising of class coordinators, subject coordinators of undergraduate and postgraduate courses discuss on the placement of theory block, clinical block, sessional examination, university examination, annual vacation, common dates for student activities under the guidance of Dean and Associate Dean of the institution. Based on the discussions, class wise master plan is prepared and circulated for any modifications/ suggestions. Once the master plans are finalized by all the programs, compiled academic master plan is prepared before the commencement of the new academic year and is strictly adhered by the faculty and students.

Sessional Examinations

The 1st and 2nd sessional examination compiled time table is prepared for UG and PG courses based on the Academic Maser Plan. The time table is sent to e-pad team for their planning of devices. The 1st sessional and 2nd sessional examination are conducted in the month of November and April respectively. For first year students first sessional exam was conducted in January. Due to the pandemic, the 2nd sessional exam was conducted online through MS teams for all the batches. The repeat exam is planned within a week of each sessional exam for students who were absent due to genuine reasons. The results of the sessional examination is enabled for students to view (e-cloud system) within 15 days after the sessional examination. Students and parents also can view their marks through SIS (Student Information System) portal.

University Examinations

As per the intimation from the Registrar Evaluation, Dean, HoDs, Exam coordinator, Class Coordinators and Subject Coordinators decide the tentative dates for university examinations in the month of March every year and detailed plan is sent to Registrar Evaluation for approval. The students' details for the exam is sent to epad team for preparation for the exam. The Internal Assessment marks of the students are sent to Registrar Evaluation 15 days before the commencement of examinations. Hall ticket is issued to the students two days before the commencement of exams. The result of students is announced within 15 days after the last paper evaluation of the exams. Supplementary examinations will be planned within six weeks after the announcement of university examination results. Due to the pandemic, onsite examination was conducted only to the final year students whereas for other batches online end of the year exam was conducted.

Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecological Nursing, Manipal College of Nursing, Manipal organized an Effective Alumni Engagement Guest Lecture on "Scope of nursing in military services and challenges faced" on 17 April 2021 between 10.00 am & 11.00 am for I and II year MSc Nursing students and I year PBBSc nursing and IV year BSc Nursing students through Microsoft Teams Platform. Capt. Philby Babu Menachery MSc (N) 2013-2015 Batch alumnus, currently working as Nursing Officer, Base Hospital Delhi Cantt., New Delhi, India spoke on the topic. She briefed on Military Nursing, how one can join Military Nursing Services (MNS), the role of nurses in MNS, job responsibilities at different levels for nurses as per their designation, special benefits available to the nurses, activities which are prohibited and challenges faced, and also briefed on some of the carrier opportunities available. A total of 32 participants including students and faculty members of the college attended the session.

Ms Pratibha, Assistant Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecological Nursing, MCON expressed gratitude to Capt. Philby Babu Menachery for accepting the invitation and sharing her expertise on the subject with the students. The interesting, inspiring and elaborate session ended at 11:00 am.

Curriculum Development:

6th Curriculum convention on Simulation-Based Competency Assessment organised by Manipal College of Nursing, MAHE Manipal

Amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, most of the health professional students are physically distant from the classrooms that has considerably changed the dynamics of education system. In order to develop the clinical competence among students, simulation has emerged as a promising teaching strategy that facilitates learning of students considering current and future challenges. Curriculum convention is one of the deliberate efforts put forth by the Excellence in Education team of MCON, Manipal, to empower learning experiences of students and enrich teaching methods of faculty in order to cater to the growing needs and demands. Manipal College of Nursing, MAHE, Manipal organized a virtual curriculum convention on Simulation Based Competency Assessment through MS Teams platform on 19th December 2020. Mrs Meghana Sudhir, Simulation Educator, Institute for Excellence in Health Professions Education, MBRU, Dubai, UAE was the Chief Guest. She emphasized the importance of simulation in teaching learning experience and highlighted the purposes of simulation which includes education, assessment, research and health integration in facilitating patient safety. She also sensitized the group on team based simulation and curriculum integration of simulation. The resource person for the session was Mr. Linto Andrews, Senior Simulation training, officer - NRSC, JHPIEGO, New Delhi. Dr. Anice George, Dean welcomed the gathering and emphasized the significance of the curriculum convention and the theme for the day "Simulation based competency assessment", which is the need of the hour to keep ourselves updated and provide best curricular experiences to the students. Dr Judith A Noronha, Excellence in Education Pillar Head & Associate Dean gave an overview regarding the curriculum convention. Mr Linto Andrews during his session on simulation based competency assessment spoke on Simulation as a technique that promotes experiential and reflective learning and can also be used as teaching and evaluation tool. He also highlighted on different models of simulators that can mimic varied student learning experience. He also explained that simulation based learning promotes patient safety, offers opportunities to practice and acquire clinical skills, and provides students to experience safe learning environment. Mr Linto Andrews also stressed on importance of debriefing its steps, process, types that encourages reflective practices of students. Developing simulation scenarios is one of the significant step of teaching learning activity. The session was followed by department wise group activity on developing case scenarios for simulation in breakout rooms of MS Teams, which were later presented with final modifications from experts. The session concluded with closing remarks by the Dr Judith A Noronha in taking forward this activity by each department and gradually finalizing the case scenarios. Mrs. Binu Margaret, Assistant Professor and Convenor of the program proposed vote of thanks.

Teaching and Learning: Impartus: Video Platform for Lecture Capture

Manipal College of Nursing implemented Impartus to enhance the learning outcomes of the students. It provides innovative video-enabled learning solutions that drive better outcomes for educational institutions. The facility was initiated in the academic year 2018-19 for the 2nd year BSc Nursing and 3rd Year BSc nursing classrooms. The video lecture capture benefitted our 220 students for the last year and is currently in use. The students can download and install Impartus mobile application from the play store to see the videos.

Sessional Examination:

Examination and Evaluation

• Evaluation is done by the faculty within one week after the examination and online answer scripts (Epad) will be available to the students for viewing answer papers (5 days). Marks will be finalized after clarification from the students. All the students who used E-pad will be informed through email about release of answer scripts for student viewing.

Objectives of the practice

Specific skill development is necessary along with the course requirements. Nurses on the academic and practice side can update their knowledge and skill through these short term courses. Keeping this in view, the institution has involved several short term certificate program which could be offered to the nurse educators as well as practicing nurses. The main goal is to build specialized skills in a specific area.

The context

Leadership ability of the nurses needs to be enhanced to take new challenges in the practicing area. Evidence-Based Practice is necessary for providing quality care to the patients. As a result, various discussions were conducted to streamline some of the concerns like who can enroll in this course and the duration of the course. The challenges faced were that the Practicing Nurses, as well as Nurse Educators, found it difficult because of the tight academic and hospital duty schedule. These programs are purely optional and after the course, a certificate will be given to the participants. In the context of higher education, competency is very essential for learners to excel in their profession. These courses are developed to prepare learners to work in a specialized area with enhanced skills. In the present situation, a lot of importance is given to the competency of the nursing fraternity if they would like to work in a speciality area. The learners should foresee the challenges ahead and prepare themselves for the sustainability of the profession.

The practice

The institution has identified two courses for nurse educators and practicing nurses. The advertisement regarding the course sent through email to various organizations. The total duration of the course is three months with 40 hours for each course. The eligibility for Advanced Nursing Leadership and Management course is Diploma/ Graduation/ Post-graduation in Nursing The eligibility for Evidence-Based Practice in Nursing is Postgraduation in Nursing. The 100 percent attendance is compulsory and the learners should appear for the exam and at the end certificate will be given to them. These particular courses are being done to equip the learners to enhance their skill and also the employability in specialized areas. Hands-on experience is also integrated into these courses.

Evidence of success

The success is measured in terms of the number of learners who are the takers for specific courses, feedback from the faculty members and learners. The result indicates the success of the program. The result will help the organizers to decide on the continuation of the program.

Problems encountered and resource required

Less number of takers. Faculty members need to spend additional time on the conduct of this course.

The resources required are:

Manpower: Identify the faculty members who are experts to conduct the program

Time: The course is done during the regular academic session so proper planning of time management is required. Faculty need to mentor the participants in preparing the best evidences for practice in their area of work.

Infrastructure: Institution has the required infrastructure for the conduct of the program

Best Practice II

Title of practice- Overseas Training

Objectives of Practice

The main objective is to share expertise with overseas nurses and to enhance their knowledge and skill in Advanced clinical practice. The institution believes in sharing expertise with other institutions to bring development in the nursing profession.

The Context

Enhancing the knowledge and skill in the Advanced clinical area is very important to meet the demands of health care as well as to improve the professional development of practicing nurses. This training was initiated based on the need for overseas nurses. A lot of discussions had taken place between the two organizations to materialize the plan and the certification program. An MOU was initiated between MAHE and Al Salam, Kuwait for the conduct of the program.

The Practice

Our institution initiated this overseas training in the year 2016. This training is given for six days (36 hours) We have trained around 600 nurses. Training is offered by qualified faculty. The course is certified by the Manipal College of Nursing. The training areas include Advanced Critical Care Nursing, Advanced Medical-Surgical and Geriatric Nursing, Advanced Pediatric Nursing, Advanced Obstetric and Midwifery Nursing, Advanced Emergency care, Advanced Leadership and Management. Training includes both theory and practice of the skill. Each participant will get a chance to practice the skill during the training program.

Evidence of Success

Objective feedback from the participants has detailed positive comments and areas for improvement. The administrators have highly appreciated the sessions conducted by the Manipal faculty. Based on the success of the program the MOU is renewed every year and the training is ongoing.

Problems encountered and resources required

Since this training is planned well ahead there were no concerns about the conduct of the training.

The resources required are:

Manpower: Identify the faculty members who are experts to conduct the program **Time**: Faculty need to spend one week onsite for the training.
