

b. Academic Programs:

The college conducts D Pharm, B Pharm, M Pharm, Pharm D and Pharm D Post Baccalaureate and Ph D programmes. M Pharm is offered in 11 specializations based on the industry and academic needs. These specializations are Pharmaceutics, Industrial Pharmacy, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutical Marketing, Pharmaceutical Administration, Pharmacy Practice, Pharmaceutical Quality Assurance, Drug Regulatory Affairs and Pharmaceutical Biotechnology. The college has been offering PhD programmes for the last three decades.
